#### **CAMP PEPIN**

For Camp Pepin, 2020 will be remembered as the year we pivoted. For the second time ever, summer camp was cancelled. The last time this happened was during the polio epidemic in 1946. The decision to cancel residential camp was a tough one and came after several months of trying to create a plan that would keep kids and staff healthy and safe while attending camp. In the end, Camp Pepin, like the majority



of other residential camps nationwide, decided to cancel. However, Camp was still able to find a way for people to enjoy time on the shores of Lake Pepin. Camp pivoted to offering our cabins for rental to families. Just over 165 cabins were rented in 2020 – many renters experienced Camp Pepin for the first time. In addition, Camp benefited from many hours of volunteer work throughout the summer. While we were thankful to have had camp be utilized in a different way last summer, we are looking forward to campers returning in 2021.



#### **DISTANCE LEARNING**

In November, the YMCA supported distance learning for 19 kindergarten to 6th grade students who made the Y the place to participate in their virtual classes and work on their school work. Students were able to return to school in mid-January.



# VIDEOS FOR RED WING **PUBLIC SCHOOLS**

Wing Public School students in 1st through 6th grades to do at home while schools were closed. The school was awarded a Cares Act Grant and provided students with equipment including balls, jump ropes, and hacky sacks. Heather created over a dozen videos for the kids to use with their equipment and another dozen workout videos to keep kids moving while they were doing their lessons from home.

## **SUNSHINE CORNER**

Virtual lessons were taught to our pre-school classes and consisted of circle time with songs, stories and demonstrations of projects students could complete at home with their families. Families also picked up activity packets containing project materials and story ideas.

#### **SUPPORT FOR THE YMCA IN 2020**

- 325 gifts totaling \$216,470 to the annual campaign to support scholarships and areas of greatest need. Many of these were from members who converted their membership dues to donations while our Y was closed.
- 39 local area businesses supported the Y through the Banner Program.
- 191 scholarships were awarded to participate in Y membership and programs.
- Support was provided to assist with creating healthy opportunities for members while the YMCA building was closed. Virtual programming included fitness classes, phy ed for schools, and active older adult programming. In addition, equipment was loaned out to members to use at home.
- \$198,096 in new gifts were added to the endowment and 11 new members joined the Heritage Club

#### **150TH ANNIVERSARY**

In 2020, the Red Wing Family YMCA celebrated its 150th Anniversary of serving the community. While the Y has changed since its inception in 1869, meeting the needs of the Red Wing community has always been paramount to the mission. Many events, gatherings and celebrations were planned to mark this momentous milestone. The Mayor of Red Wing declared that August 2020 was



Red Wing YMCA Month in honor of the 150th Anniversary. However, the global pandemic caused many of those occasions to be cancelled, which does not diminish the impact that the Y has had on the health and well-being of the community.

#### **ESSENTIAL SUPPLY DRIVE**

Many in our community were impacted by the death of George Floyd and the protests and social unrest in the Twin Cities. When it became clear that our neighbors were in need, our community came together to donate supplies to the most devastated areas. Volunteers and staff from our Y organized a donation drive and over the course of two days. collected bottled water, non-perishable food items, household supplies, formula, and diapers. Four cars were loaded with supplies and driven to two Twin Cities Area YMCAs for distribution to people in need.
